LECTURES: International agricultural organizations – historical outline, role in the economic and social development of countries. FAO – goals and tasks, world food situation, food security and food safety, improvements and advances in agricultural production, exchange and distribution of agricultural products, stabilization of the prices of agricultural raw materials. WTO – agricultural trade and market regulations, role in international trade liberalization, promoting free competition. OECD – goals, function, prospects for agricultural development. CEFTA – participation in establishing a free trade zone and protecting agriculture. OIE – global monitoring and control of livestock diseases and the quality of animal-based products, standardization of animal identification systems. ISNAR – research programs in crop and animal production. APHCA – promoting animal production, diagnosis and control of livestock diseases. Agricultural professional organizations in the European arena, their activities and projects. Domestic agricultural organizations.
