Substantive content

SEMINARS: CONTENT OF SEMINARS 1. Philosophical aspects of professionalism in the various concepts of health and disease, including philosophical, cultural and ethnic determinants of human behavior, philosophical background of moral, medical and academic aspects and the autonomy of the individual. 2. The professionalism of professional and social development: the rules of professional relationship between: doctor-patient, the doctor-patient-family of the patient, doctor-doctor, doctor-society. 3. Violation of the principles of medical professionalism and responsibility for their own behavior. 4. Academic professionalism. 5. The professionalism of scientific research, particularly bioethical aspects.

Learning purpose : This course is designed to introduce you to the basic principles of professionalism and professional behavior with particular emphasis on ethical and moral principles in professional practice. By the end of the course you should be familiar with the basic definitions and the division into academic professionalism, professional and social development. You will have knowledge of the philosophical aspects of professional behavior, you will know how to act to make the patient's welfare a priority of the proceedings, how to professional conduct in doctor-patient relationships, physician-patient-family of the patient, the doctor-doctor. You will know the rules of academic professionalism, adhere of academic etiquette and academic ethical code, know the rules of professionalism in research, understand the concept of fairness in science and understand what the plagiarism is.

Knowledge: He understands the importance of verbal and non-verbal communication in the process of communication with the patient and the concept of trust in interaction with the patient.

Knows the principles of academic, social and professional professionalism

Skills: Student adheres to ethical standards in professional activities; adheres to of patients' rights including: the right to protection of personal data, the right to privacy, the right to information about the health, the right to give informed consent to treatment or withdrawal from it and the right to a dignified death.
