Substantive content

CLASSES : Clinical examination of the psychiatric patient (psychiatric interview, family history and mental state examination). Disturbances of consciousness, attention and perception. Disturbances of thinking, speech, memory and intelligence. Disturbances of emotions (affect, mood, anxiety anger). Motor behavior disturbances. Psychiatric syndromes.

SEMINARS: Communication skill with mentally ill patients. Psychiatric examination. Disturbances of sexual activity. The most common sleep disorders. The most common eating disorders. Different "schools" of psychotherapy. Emergency psychiatry: violence and suicide risk assessment serotonin and neuroleptic malignant syndromes, prophylaxis and treatment.

LECTURES: The history of psychiatry. Development of most common trends and ideas of mental disease. Psychodynamic and biological psychiatry. Psychopathology of adult mentally ill patients. The etiology of psychological disorders. The conscience disturbances. Attention and memory - pathophysiology. Cognitive disorders. Disturbances of psycho-motor activity. The child and adolescent psychiatry. Personality disorders - from pathophysiology to treatment.

Learning purpose:

The student will be able to know how to provide interviews technique psychiatric history and mental state examination. He will be able to define the particular symptoms typical for impairment of consciousness, memory cognition, affective and behavioral disorders. The student will be able to differentiate and diagnose of the mental diseases and neurotic disturbances (min. 50 znaków, max. 100 znaków)

On completion of the study programme the graduate will gain:

Knowledge:

The graduate knows and understands: basic concepts of pathogenesis of mental disorders; the issue of adaptation of the patient and his family to the disease as a difficult situation and to related events, including dying and the process of family mourning; the general symptomatology of mental disorders and the principles of their classification according to the main classification systems; the symptoms, principles of diagnosis and therapeutic management in the most common mental disorders, including: schizophrenia, affective disorders, neurotic and adaptive disorders, eating disorders, disorders related to taking psychoactive substances, sleep disorders; the principles of diagnostics and emergency procedures in psychiatry, including suicide issues; the specificity of mental disorders and their

treatment in children, adolescents and in old age; the symptoms of mental disorders in the course of somatic diseases, their impact on the course of the underlying disease and prognosis and the principles of their treatment;

the issues of human sexuality and basic disorders related to it; the regulations of mental health protection with particular regard to the rules of admission to a psychiatric hospital.

Skills:

The graduate is able to assess and describe the somatic and mental state of the patient; The graduate can conduct a psychiatric examination.

Social Competencies:

The graduate is ready to : establish and maintain deep and respectful contact with the patient and show understanding for ideological and cultural differences; be guided by the well-being of the patient; keep medical secrecy and to respect patient's rights.
