Substantive content:

CLASSES: Organization and operations of border veterinary inspection services. Tasks of the Border Veterinary Inspector. TRACES system. Stages of the customs clearance process. Physical control of products of animal origin. Document control. Border control in a seaport, preparation for physical control, documentation control. Cooperation with veterinary inspection of other UE countries, cooperation with third (non-UE) countries. Rules for the import and transit of feed materials and feed additives. Principles of conducting physical control - laboratory tests. Administrative proceedings in border control.

LECTURES: Veterinary inspection of trade in animals and feedstuffs within the EU; Veterinary inspection of third-country trade in animals and feedstuffs; Veterinary inspection of trade in foods of animal origin within the EU; Veterinary inspection of trade in foods of animal origin with third countries; Organization and operations of border veterinary inspection services and harmonization of control procedures with EU requirements; Inspection certificates, inspection regulations, border veterinary inspection procedures; Veterinary inspection of trade within the EU and with third countries; Trade in animals and animal products within the EU.

Learning purpose: Organization and operations of border veterinary inspection services. Tasks of the Border Veterinary Inspector.

On completion of the study programme the graduate will gain:

Knowledge: Graduates will be familiar with legal acts regulating trade in animals, products of animal origin and feedstuffs.

Skills: Graduates will be able to interpret legal requirements relating to the operations of veterinary inspection services.

Social Competencies: Graduates will be able to supervise operations relating to trade in animals, products of animal origin and feedstuffs.
