Substantive content

CLASSES: Strategies and techniques used to teach learners with mild intellectual disabilities in inclusive and segregative settings (special focus on: differentiated instruction, discussion, independent worksheets, assessments, projects, reports, reading, writing, drawing, group work). Teaching mathematics – guidelines for teachers of learners with mild intellectual disabilities. Practical guidelines – how to prepare a good lesson plan for learners with mild intellectual disabilities in inclusive and segregative settings.

LECTURES: Intellectual disability: naming, defining, classifying. Prevalence of intellectual disabilities. Common behavioral and psychological features of students with mild intellectual disabilities. The environment of school and its impact on learners with mild intellectual disabilities. Students' with mild intellectual disabilities needs. Methods used in education of students with mild intellectual disabilities. A lesson plan for students with mild intellectual disabilities: aims, methods, forms of work, aids, content.

Learning purpose: Providing students with knowledge on methods of teaching learners with mild intellectual disabilities.

Knowledge: The graduate student will gain knowledge on methods and strategies of teaching learners with mild intellectual disabilities
