## **CLASSES:**

The aim of exercise is delivering the Erasmus students of law basic information about criminal procedure in Poland understood as a set of legal norms regulating procedural activities aimed at the implementation of substantive criminal law. In all countries the purpose of the criminal procedure is to determine whether to manage the activity of deleting crimes, the detecting its efficiency and bringing it to criminal application. But not all countries have similar criminal procedures. Students will have the opportunity to learn about the Polish criminal procedure and they will be able to compare it with the systems functioning in their countries.

Learning purpose: presentation of criminal procedure in Poland

Knowledge: knowledge of basic institutional principles of the functioning of criminal procedure

Skills: ability to use legal language in functioning of criminal procedure

Social Competencies: openness to various problems, the solution of which requires independence of thinking involving acquired knowledge and skills
